- Sarah Mae Downie Park/Butterfly Garden Chris Switzer and Beth Hoffman
 - o The Wise, Wonderful Wednesday Weed Whackers continue with bi-monthly maintenance in the park.
 - o All planting has been completed for the season.
 - o Regarding the lottery for the bench at Sarah Mae Downie Park, we have 5 families who have asked to be entered into the drawing during our August meeting. The lottery closes on July 31.

 - o The Broadway/19th entrance is looking great.

 - This corner lot garden that featured primarily lawn was recently redesigned adding planted perimeter beds and gravel pathways. A raised vegetable bed with climbing trellis personalizes the space and a small center lawn softens the overall design.
